#### **NEW ISSUE NEWS**

The seventh issue released for 2005 was "The Centenary of the Birth of Sir Solomon Hochoy 1905-2005" on the 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2005. The issue was placed on sale on the 22<sup>nd</sup> October but was withdrawn by 10:30am – the reason being that a government ministry wished belatedly to hold a ceremony. Sale of the issue resumed approximately two weeks later. The date of issue on the FDC stated 22<sup>nd</sup> September.

The issue consisted of five stamps featuring photographs: \$1.00 – with the late Prime Minister Dr. Eric Williams; \$2.50 – with His Imperial Majesty Haile Salassie I (1966); \$3.75 – with Lady Thelma Hochoy; \$4.50 – with H.M. Queen Elizabeth II (1966); \$5.25 - Inspecting Guard of Honour. A Souvenir Sheet was produced which featured a photograph of a seated Sir Solomon Hochoy containing one \$15.00 stamp. The photographs used for the \$1.00 and \$5.25 stamps were supplied by the Trinidad & Tobago Government Information Service. The photographs used for the other stamps and the Souvenir Sheet were taken by Noel Norton.

The stamps were printed in Colombia by Thomas Greg and Sons De Colombia S.A. The graphics were done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. The issue was designed by Albert Sydney. The FDC's were sold at \$19.00 each and the Souvenir Sheets at \$15.00 each. A brochure was produced for the issue. TTPost also produced a 'Framed Collection' at \$250.00 each. Members can also refer to Bulletin #225/4 for another article on Sir Solomon Hochoy.

The eighth issue released for 2005 was the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Induction of Women Police (Fig.2). The issue was released on the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2005 and consisted of one Souvenir Sheet containing one \$15.00 stamp. The Souvenir Sheet featured a photograph taken on the 25<sup>th</sup> August 1955 of the twelve women, chosen from a field of 2000 applicants, who were recruited and began training to become police officers.

The Souvenir Sheet was printed by Thomas Greg and Sons De Colombia S.A. and the graphics were done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. TTPost did not produce any FDC's for this issue. The Souvenir Sheets were sold at \$15.00 each. A brochure was produced for this issue.




Fig. 4: ANANSI AND THE CRICKET MATCH FDC

The ninth issue of 2005 was the T&T Children against Cancer (Fig.3). The issue was released on the 7<sup>th</sup> November and consisted of one Souvenir Sheet containing one \$15.00 stamp. TTPost worked with the T&T Cancer Society to produce this issue. The aim was to edify the public on the risks associated with smoking and to discourage the habit by targeting children.

The Souvenir Sheet was printed by Thomas Greg and Sons De Colombia S.A. and the graphics done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. TTPost did not produce any FDC's for this issue. The Souvenir Sheets were sold at \$20.00 each. The \$5.00 extra charge went to the T&T Cancer Society. A brochure was produced for this issue.

The tenth issue (Christmas 2005) was Anansi and the Cricket Match (Fig.4). The issue was released on the 12<sup>th</sup> December and consisted of five stamps which featured scenes of cartoon characters: \$1.00, \$2.50 \$3.75, \$4.50 and \$5.25. The five stamps related a children's story, Anansi and the Cricket Match. The story was contained in the brochure which must be read to follow the scenes depicted on the stamps. The Souvenir Sheet was produced with one \$5.00 stamp which illustrated another scene from the Anansi story.

The stamps were printed by Thomas Greg and Sons De Colombia S.A. and the graphics done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. The stamps reproduced paintings by Warren Le Plait. The FDC's were sold at \$19.00 each and the Souvenir Sheets at \$15.00 each.




Fig.5: CENTRAL BANK OF T&T COMMEMORATIVE COVER

On the stamps and souvenir sheets TTPost has the words 'Children Stamp Issue'. The cost to a parent of this 'Children Stamp Issue' for one set, one FDC and one S/S is \$51.00. If the parent wishes to spend more, a 'Framed Collection' of the issue is available at \$250.00 each. Parents normally purchase one set / FDC / S/S for each child, but we do not know how enthusiastic they will be to purchase this issue for their children.

The Central Bank of Trinidad & Tobago held a philatelic and numismatic exhibition at the Central Bank in Port-of-Spain during the period  $8th-30^{th}$  November. They produced a commemorative cover for the event (Fig.5). The cover bears a \$1.00 stamp of the Inauguration of the International Criminal Court issue. All stamps used on the covers had the perforations on the right-hand cut off. The covers were presented at no charge to the visitors at the exhibition. We have obtained covers for our members. Write to the Hon. Secretary, Robert Franco, or collect it at our monthly POS meeting – there is no charge for the cover. The exhibition consisted mainly of the T&T Solid Waste Management Company Ltd. philatelic & numismatic T&T collection on the environment, the Central Bank display of currency notes and coins and stamps of Belize. The Central Bank is interested in bringing together the numismatic collectors to form a society.

- 4) 2<sup>nd</sup> May (approximately). Coastal Dreamscope booklet ten \$1.00 stamps.

- 5) 18<sup>th</sup> May (approximately). Local Herbal Medicinal Plants 25c, 50c, 75c, \$1.00, \$3.00, \$3.25, \$4.00, \$5.00, \$10.00 and \$20.00.
- 6) 27<sup>th</sup> June. Caribbean Postal Union Conference. Commemorative cover.
- 7) 15<sup>th</sup> August. Tobago Heritage Festival \$1.00, \$2.50, \$3.75, \$4.50 & \$5.25. Souvenir Sheet with one \$15.00 stamp.
- 8) 22<sup>nd</sup> October. Sir Solomon Hochoy \$1.00, \$2.50, \$3.75, \$4.50 & \$5.25. Souvenir Sheet with one \$15.00 stamp.
- 9) 30<sup>th</sup> September. 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Women Police. Souvenir Sheet only with one \$15.00 stamp.
- 10) 7<sup>th</sup> November. T&T Children against Cancer. Souvenir Sheet only with one \$15.00 stamp.
- 11) 8th November. Central Bank of Trinidad & Tobago Commemorative cover.
- 12) 12<sup>th</sup> December. Anansi and the Cricket Match \$1.00, \$2.50, \$3.75, \$4.50 & \$5.25. Souvenir Sheet with one \$15.00 stamp.

Presently, the only news we have of the 2006 Stamp Programme are two issues under consideration: Caribbean Single Market Economy and the late Pope John Paul II.

## LADY McLEOD SILVER INGOT




LEFT: FRONT OF INGOT

On the back of the ingot is stated – TRINIDAD / 1847 / STERLING / Copyright symbol F82. The size of the ingot is much smaller than the stamp. In the January 2006 issue of the Scott Stamp Monthly, in the "To Err" Column, is an article on the error. The errors are listed as Scott #681B and #681C with no value stated for them. The stamps with the correct spelling are listed as Scott #679 and #681.
