NEW ISSUE NEWS



CENTENNIAL OF THE REOPENING OF THE RED HOUSE

The second issue released for 2007 was the 'Centennial of the Reopening of the Red House 1907 - 2007 ' on the 14th September. The issue consisted of four stamps: \$ 1.00 - photograph of Red House circa 1907; \$ 2.50 - The Parliament Chamber; \$ 3.75 - The Cenotaph and External Flame; \$ 5.25 - The Red House Rotunda and Fountain. A Souvenir Sheet was produced with a single \$ 15 stamp featuring the Red House as seen from Woodford Square.

The issue was printed by Thomas Greg & Sons de Columbia S.A. and the graphics were done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. The FDC's were sold at \$ 19.00 each and the Souvenir Sheets at \$ 15.00 each. A brochure was prepared for the issue.

ST. MARY'S CHILDREN'S HOME 150th ANNIVERSARY FDC

The third issue released on 21st September commemorated \$t. Mary's Children's Home 150th Anniversary 1857-2007. The i-ssue consisted of four stamps: \$ 1.00 - St. Mary's Children's Home Main Entrance circa 1930; \$ 2.50 - The Fountain; \$ 3.75 - St. Mary's Anglican Church; \$ 4.50 - St. Mary's Children's Home Cub Pack. No souvenir sheet was produced for this issue.

The issue was printed by Thomas Greg & Sons de Columbia S.A. And The graphics were done by Troy Rhodes of DesignWise. The FDC's were sold at \$ 19.00 each. A brochure was produced for the issue.

Two other issues are planned for the balance of 2007. A new definitive set featuring architecture will be released at the end of November / December. The set will consist of nine stamps. The historic buildings (the 'Magnificent Seven') around the Queen's Park Savannah will be included in the set. A Souvenir Sheet only will be issued to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Montreal Protocol which phased out the use of chloroflurocarbons (CFC's). These CFC's are generally believed to be harmful to the ozone layer.

In 2008, there will be no Carnival issue, but among the issues planned are the 60th Anniversary of the University of the West Indies and a stamp booklet on Fresh Water fishes.

MEMBERSHIP DUES



UNITED NATIONS - COIN & FLAG SERIES

The United Nations Postal Administration issued the second set in its Coin and Flag Series on the 3rd May 2007. The issue consisted of 24 stamps featuring coins and flags from member states. Eight of the stamps were for use at the UN Post Offices in New York City, eight at the Geneva offices and the remaining eight at the Vienna offices.

"IRINIDAD UND TOBAGO" was featured on the stamps used at the UNPA offices in Wien, Austria. The denomination of the stamp was 0.55 Euro, a postal rate in Austria. The design of the sheet of stamps placed four countries in a block of four with margins. T&T shared the block with Sierra Leone, Croatia and Spain. The coin featured on the stamp is the 50c coin which is not seen often in circulation. The side of the coin shown illustrates T&T's national musical instrument, the steel pan.


On the top left margin corner of the block of four is printed another T&T flag. Also in this second set is Barbados. The Barbados stamp has a denomination of 39c for use at the UNPA offices in New York. Members who wish the stamp can place their orders at the United Nations Postal Administration, P.O. POSTMARK - RECEIVED WITH TAPE

The problem of mail tampering was reported in an article in the Trinidad Guardian of 23rd November 2007. The Managing Director of TTPost, Colin Lucas, stated that close to one million TT dollars (approximately US \$ 151,000) was spent on security and surveillance upgrades at the National Mail Centre yet the problem persists.

An example of tampered mail is illustrated below. The airmail envelope from abroad was opened and the contents were removed. The thief resealed the empty envelope with brown plastic adhesive tape. When the envelope was discovered by TTPost, the 'RECEIVED WITH TAPE' postmark and NMC oval datestamp were applied. The postmark measures 4mm X 53mm. Both postmark and datestamp are rubber-stamps. The level of this illegal activity indicates that this postmark should be very common.

ADVERTISING PICTURE POSTCARDS - PENTOTHAL

The PPC on the following page is a method of advertising not common to T&T. The postcard was franked with the 12c stamp of the 1960 definitive. The stamp was cancelled by the Woodbrook datestamp, 2nd July 1961. The printed message was made to appear hand-written. The message was an advertisement for PENTOTHAL made by the pharmaceutical company Abbot. The card was made mailed to a doctor in the USA. When a doctor received this card in the mail, the doctor may think the PPC is from a friend visiting Trinidad. This form of advertising can be quite effective.
