#### NEW DESIGN OF THE INDICIA ON THE PREPAID ENVELOPE

The Prepaid envelopes size 4 1/8" X 9 1/2" (without window) has been reprinted with major changes. This envelope was previously reprinted in 2010 and the indicia was redrawn (see Bulletin # 253). In the last quarter of 2011 another reprint of the envelope with a new design indicia was observed. The indicia illustrated a map of T&T enclosed within a double-lined border. The map was drawn using a fine dot-screen in red with two diagonal stripes in white. A sans-serif font was used for the text 'Postage Paid within Trinidad and Tobago'. Also the TTPost logo printed on the inside of the envelope was made much larger.

The first stamp issue for 2012 will honour T&T's first female Prime Minister. Up to press time, a date has not been set for the release.

The Paria Waterfall was illustrated on one of the two new aerogrammes. To visit the waterfall one must go to Blanchisseuse, followed by a three hour hike to Paria Bay. From Paria Bay, it is only a short walk to the waterfall.

#### PSTT AWARDS

The PSTT presented Appreciation Awards to two very special persons in 2011. Each award consisted of a plaque of Juniper wood, laser engraved with an image of the Lady McLeod stamp and suitable text.

The first award was presented to life-member, Mrs. Noreen George, for her devoted work to the PSTT. Noreen has been a 'workhorse' and an 'engine' in the Society for decades. Those who came to our Port of Spain meetings and the San Fernando meetings (when we had them) know her well. Noreen is now retired from active service in the Society.

The second award was presented to life-member, Dr. Reuben Ramkissoon, for his lifetime of service to the Philately of T&T. Over the years, Ben has done a tremendous amount of research into the postal history of T&T. His articles on Trinidad, Tobago and T&T have appeared in numerous publications over the past 60 years including the British Caribbean Philatelic Journal, The London Philatelist, American Philatelist, Airpost Journal and the PSTT Bulletin. Also, he co-authored the books 'Trinidad - A Philatelic History to 1913' and the 'Town and Village Postmarks of T&T'.

Ben has exhibited many of his collections around the world. Some of the awards are FIP Championship (Large Gold) - Trinidad 1797 to 1913, FIP (Gold) - Postal Stationery of Trinidad and World War I Red Cross Label that became a Postage Stamp for a Day. National Awards include Tobago Traditional exhibit, Airmails of T&T, Revenues of T&T, 50 years of BWIA, The Trinidad Connections of the 1931 DO-X South American Flight, The 1898 2nd Columbus Discovery of Trinidad, King George V Britannia issues of T&T, King George V Silver Jubilee of T&T, Numeral Cancellations of Trinidad and the 1956 QEII one cent on two cent overprint of T&T.

## QSL CARDS (Part 2)

The first part of this article was published in Bulletin # 254. Here are a few points to note.

Amateur Radio Operators must first pass a proficiency test to obtain their radio license. During World War II, all radio activity by the Ham radio operators was banned. Ham radio operations first began with the Morse Code transmissions (dots and dashes) and later came the voice transmissions.





Fig.4: Reverse of a QSL card from VP4TZ (Central Radio Propagation Laboratory, Fort Read) confirming a reception on the 12th April 1947. The card was mailed to England and has the machine cancellation of Army Post Office 869 (Fort Read, Wallerfield) in front.







Fig.5: Front (top) and reverse (bottom) of a QSL card from VP4TC (D.Serrao) confirming a reception with W2UK on the 12th March 1934. The card was mailed to New York, USA. The card was franked with two meter stamps: one pence and half-penny (equivalent to 3¢). The postage meter, Neopost 4, was registered to T. Geddes Grant Ltd., POS.




Fig.7: Front (top) and reverse (bottom) of a QSL card from VP4TN (R. Eric Duff. Woodbrook) confirming a reception with W3HWZ on the 10th March 1939. The card was mailed to Baltimore, Maryland. The one cent stamp was cancelled by the POS date-stamp - 22nd June 1939.
